Postpartum Haemorrhage (PPH) is excessive bleeding after childbirth. Globally about 800 women die daily due to childbirth complications. Most of these deaths occur in Sub-Saharan Africa. Raising awareness on PPH equips communities with information that empowers them with lifesaving practices such as seeking health care services early.

Ministry of Health (MoH) Uganda, set aside the month of August to raise awareness on PPH which is the leading cause of maternal deaths. *To page 3*

Blood donation drive

To raise awareness on Postpartum Haemorrhage, Save the Mothers East Africa (STMEA) partnered with Certified Public Accountants (CPA), eastern Uganda chapter in a blood donation drive on 29 July to 3 Aug 2024. About 1000 units of blood were donated.

The drive was wrapped up with a meeting where Dr Nsubuga Mushin, Executive Director ST-MEA, presented on the importance of blood donation. He also stressed the need to address the factors that lead to delay in seeking medical health care that result into complications such as PPH. Addressing such factors is a role of multidisciplinary professionals, Dr Nsubuga noted as he invited accountants to make safe motherhood part of their agenda.

Tribute to John Alan Jeffs

As Save the Mothers joins MoH to raise awareness on Postpartum haemorrhage (PPH), we pay tribute to one of our donors, John Alan Jeffs who passed on recently.

Alan and his family generously invested in life saving interventions in maternity units in Uganda hospitals. Alan worked with his family to support the set-up of maternity High Dependency Units (HDU) in health facility where many mothers

with pregnancy and child birth life threatening complications such as PPH are managed and their lives saved.

He also equipped six health facilities with non-pneumatic antishock garments. These garments are used in the stabilisation of mothers with heavy bleeding in shock following child birth during referral to high level health care facilities.
